Getting Confident with Watercolor



INSTRUCTOR: John Preston

John grew up on all 3 coasts and moved to lowa in 1979. He received a BFA from Maharishi International University in 1984 and has been painting full time since 1986. His initial focus was the agricultural landscape, primarily images from southeast lowa. That focus shifted to its small towns and rivers and more recently to travel subjects from Europe. He conducts workshops and participates in regional Plein Air events. He has exhibited widely in lowa and elsewhere in the U.S. His work is in numerous public and private collections including John Deere, lowa State University and the Chicago Federal Reserve.







WORKSHOP OBJECTIVES:

Success with watercolor requires an understanding of what happens when a particular consistency of paint is applied to a particular condition of paper. This understanding will allow you to make decisions while painting. The workshop will explore:

- The basic, non-negotiable properties of the medium which apply to all watercolor styles and to any type or brand of materials.
- The 3 conditions of the paper and 2 consistencies of paint that let you produce predictable results rather than hope for happy accidents.
- Interpreting subjects appropriately for watercolor.
- Planning the painting process.
- Strategies for working on location (we will learn some key techniques indoors and then work on site).

The workshop will include daily demonstrations and instruction, followed by student work with lots of instructor feedback. An indoor venue and references will be available for inclement weather.

Paints (in tubes - the first 4 are indispensable)
Ultramarine Blue
Transparent Red Iron Oxide or Burnt Sienna
Quinacridone Rose or Alizarin Crimson
Yellow Ochre

Naphthol Red or Cadmium Red Light Cadmium Yellow Light or Hansa Yellow Light or Azo Yellow Prussian Blue

2 brushes

A mop style wash brush equivalent to #14-16 in a round (squirrel or synthetic squirrel). A #10-12 nylon round

Paper

140 lb cold press (Saunders, Arches or a 100% cotton paper. *Paper quality affects outcome more than brushes or paint*).

Full sheets cut into 11"x15" quarters or an equivalent sized block

3B pencil

Kneaded eraser

Water container (should hold approximately 12 ounces)

Ordinary masking tape (PLEASE not the green or blue kind)

Palette

Something white which has pockets for the paint and separate areas to mix "puddles" (The plastic folding type are good).

Board approximately 12"x16"

Portable easel for outdoor work

Comfort items as desired (hat, sunblock, etc)
